America's Network for Chronic Disease Surveillance and the Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine hosted the conference in Las Cruces on November 9-11. This was the first USA-based conference for this international group. About 100 health professionals and medical students from Latin America, North America, the Caribbean, Europe and Asia attended. The medical professionals were interested in Extension's ability to offer evidence-based educational programming to help individuals prevent or cope with chronic diseases.
